

Council Meeting Update

Highlights from June 7, 2016



Council Meeting Minutes: Minutes from the May 10th meeting were reviewed.

Financial Reports: An additional \$33,000 has been sent to Faith Foundation as a continuing “My Stake” payment against the mortgage principal. Sally Davies, Financial Manager, has been in contact with Dan Kerr regarding the mortgage contract extension – signatures are pending.

Financial Oversight – In an effort to enhance the checks and balances of our accounting processes, two different approaches were presented for consideration. Proposals were presented by Nicki Dippel, Option 1-retaining/enhancing processes within house with Nicki providing monthly review, and Janet Brunner, Option 2-outsourcing accounting. After discussion and prayer, a motion was made by Tiffany Bouchard, seconded by Julie Oke, and passed to allow Council members time overnight to consider the options, with a vote by email to Cliff, Council President, the next day. The email vote of the Council members present at the June 7th meeting was completed June 8th with Option 1 selected. (Note: Council member Janet Brunner excused herself from participating in discussion and voting on this decision.)

New Business:

Office Manager Resignation- Effective June 30th, Kathy Hammer will be resigning as TLC’s Office Manager. She will be on vacation the week of July 4th, but will be available to train her replacement. Pastor Dave and Sally will begin the hiring process immediately.

Trikerion- We currently pay \$50 per year to retain membership in Trikerion – a “stand along” to the church when applying for grants. In the absence of Darrin Fleener and Dave McGuffey who were instrumental in setting up this relationship, there has been no activity. This will be presented to the congregation to see if anyone would be interested in taking on this function.

New Members Class- Twelve people attended the 2 ½ hour new members class on Sunday, June 5. They will be introduced to the congregation during Sunday service, June 19.

A motion was made and passed unanimously by all Council members present to approve the selection of the Call Team and Start-Up Team members and the appointment of Matt Davies as the Chairperson for the Call Team.

Transitioning toward Pastor Dave's retirement

Pastor Dave will be leaving Trinity anytime between this fall and May 17, 2017.

Members and friends of Trinity are encouraged to take a survey called the *Congregational Assessment Tool*© (CAT). The results of this survey will be used to develop the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a form required by the Synod to begin the search for our next pastor. The CAT measures the levels of satisfaction and energy within the church congregation, identifies important success factors for improvement, and discovers where members would like to take ministries in the future.

Responses are anonymous; no one will know who says what on the survey. Please take the survey on your own, without sharing your responses with others.

The assessment has **101** questions. Please plan to set aside 30 minutes to respond. The survey needs to be taken in a single session, without closing your computer's browser. If you are unable to complete the survey online, you can complete a paper survey, or use a computer at church on Sundays between June 26 and July 17 with the help of someone from one of the succession planning teams. Paper surveys are available in the church office and should be returned there by July 10. If you have questions about the CAT survey, contact any member of the Transition Team.

The results of the assessment will be heard at the Findings Retreat, July 22-24 and an action plan will be developed. (examples: identification of strengths and weaknesses, determination of priorities for ministries, description of qualities desired for the next pastor.

Following a review of the findings, participants begin a draft of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) to be completed by the Transition Team. **This document describes who Trinity is. Let your voice be heard.**



Dear Loved in Christ,

Elizabeth Gilbert recounted her own spiritual quest in the book Eat, Pray, Love. It was later made into a movie starring Julia Roberts.



Elizabeth was on a journey to find truth, searching in Italy, India, and Indonesia. However, she found her truth not far from herself. She said, "You have every right to cherry-pick when it comes to moving your spirit and finding peace in God." Her highest spiritual wisdom was: "God dwells within you as you yourself, exactly the way you are."

In his book, Vanishing Grace, Phillip Yancey mentioned the above quotes and wrote: "I shudder to imagine a universe run by a god that resembles me, exactly the way I am." (Watch the movie, "Bruce Almighty" to see how that may work out.)

The first commandment is: "I am the Lord your God, you shall have no other gods." The "other god" we love the best is ourselves, cherry-picking our gods and religious ideas from the culture so that it seems right with our inner selves.

Luther wrote in his preface to Romans that the inner self IS the problem. He said the problem is down deep in the bottom of our hearts. Our natural life is to turn and run away from God at every turn. It is God and God's grace that pull us back to God in Jesus Christ and by the Holy Spirit. The answer always comes as a gift. The answer is always the God who is not you.
